While we missed seeing everyone in person at the Brantford Golf & Country Club, maintaining the health and well-being of our communities was of utmost priority, and the event was nonetheless a great success raising over \$120,000 to support the Emergency Department redevelopment at the Brantford General Hospital.

The event was streamed live on September 18th and featured music, entertainment, messages from local community dignitaries and hospital leaders. The Foundation worked with Dr. Andrea Unger, Chief of Emergency Medicine at the BCHS, to create a special video that offered a glimpse behind the scenes in the ED. Layne "The Auctionista" returned for a fourth year to participate in the gala, hosting the show and leading a live "Fund A Need" appeal that raised \$64,000 through the generous contributions of our viewers and Foundation supporters. Also new to the event was an online auction that raised over \$11,000 thanks to enthusiastic bidders and incredible donations from community partners.

There was no cost for the gala this year making it possible for everyone to attend.

Approximately 170 viewers tuned in to the live show and over 200 additional individuals and counting have since watched the recorded event video available to be streamed on the BCHS Foundation youtube channel.

The Emergency Department (ED) is a vital asset within local health care used to treat serious illnesses and life-threatening injuries.

The provincial government has announced plans to improve the Emergency Department with a renovation and expansion. The ED is accessed by so many people in our community and the redevelopment will allow us to continue to serve the ongoing health care needs of the residents of Brantford, County of Brant and surrounding communities.

The BCHS Foundation is excited to share with you the exciting news that the BCHS ED redevelopment project is moving forward into Stage 3 of planning, the third of five stages known as the preliminary design phase.

During this stage, preliminary block and sketch level design development is completed and details about all major components, timelines and costs are prepared and submitted to the ministry for approval. Many staff and physicians are engaged in the design process through user groups. The voices of BCHS employees and physicians are a critical component in the hospital's planning.

The ED redevelopment will include enhancements such as new entrances, a new waiting area, extended stay zone and an Indigenous Healing Suite. These renovations will help us improve and ensure patient safety and privacy.

Entering a New Phase (cont'd from cover)

The province does not cover the entire cost of the ED redevelopment project, using a 90/10 funding model. This means that the BCHS Foundation must raise in excess of \$7 million to cover a portion of the renovation expenses along with new or replacement medical equipment to be used for patient care in the new space.

Included in this medical equipment is the purchase of a new CT scanner - one of the most frequently used pieces of equipment at the Brant Community Healthcare System.
